

# How to Make A Wordpress Student Blog (~\$4 per year)

1. Agree on your blog's title.
  - a. Students can propose, debate, and vote on the blog title.
  - b. Ask your students to vote on whether they want a funny/joke title, or a serious/earnest title.
  - c. **Shorter is better.**
2. Go to [www.gmail.com](http://www.gmail.com) (or another email provider)
3. Create a **NEW dedicated email account** based on the name.
  - a. This will allow you to have multiple blogs, preserving your class's community.
  - b. In settings, you can have this email forward into your default email.

4. Go to [www.wordpress.com](http://www.wordpress.com) and use the email address to register the **domain name/web address**.
  - a. Example: [www.mustangstampede.wordpress.com](http://www.mustangstampede.wordpress.com)
5. You will then create a **username and password for yourself**, so you can log into your website.

- a. You'll need to confirm your registration by clicking on a **link inside an email**.
6. Log into your website for the first time through the "backdoor".

## IMPORTANT -- HOW TO MAKE SURE YOU APPROVE COMMENTS:

1. **Click on the word "Settings"** in the left sidebar (it's near the bottom)
2. **Click "Discussion"** at the top menu bar
3. Make sure that the Comments are set to be **manually approved**:

Before a comment appears

Comment must be manually approved

Comment author must have a previously approved comment

## How to...

Change the appearance	Add a blog post	Edit the "About Us" Page
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Look at the left sidebar</li><li>2. <b>Click on the word "Themes"</b></li><li>3. Browse through the different themes<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. Get student input via a design committee!</li></ol></li><li>4. Want to change the font or color? <b>Click the white "Customize" button</b> and play with the options.</li><li>5. REMEMBER TO SAVE.</li><li>6. Click the X in the top left corner to exit.</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Look at the left sidebar.</li><li>2. Click on the <b>"Add" button</b> next to the words "Blog Post"</li><li>3. Copy and paste a student's typed blog post into the <b>word processor</b><ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. <b>Make sure it's formatted correctly!</b></li></ol></li><li>4. Click "Featured Image" on the right side to add a picture (optional)</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Look at the left sidebar</li><li>2. Click on <b>the words "Site Pages"</b></li><li>3. Click on the existing page.</li><li>4. Change the title of the page (optional)</li><li>5. Type inside the <b>word processor</b></li><li>6. Click "Featured Image" on the right side to add a picture (optional)</li></ol> <p>If you want to add more pages, <b>use the "Add" button</b>. You may need to change your menu (see last page of handout.)</p>

## Advanced, Optional, but Very Useful Changes You Can Make:

### Add more pages:

(Maybe about your school, your program, your curriculum, yourself...)

1. Look at the left sidebar.
2. Next to "Blog Pages," **click white button that says "Add"**

To have the pages appear on your blog's menu, follow the steps below for changing the menu bar.

### Change the date/time a post appeared (or schedule it for the future:)

3. Look at the left sidebar.
4. **Click "Blog Posts"**
5. Find the blog post you want to edit
6. Underneath it, **click "Edit"**
7. Look at the right sidebar
8. **Click "Status"**
9. Change the date and time.
  - a. (You can also do this with a drafted post!)
10. Click the **blue "Update" button in the top right hand corner.**

### Change the Menu Bar:

11. Look at the left sidebar.
12. Next to "Themes," **click white button that says "Customize"**
13. Inside the Customizer, click "Menus"
14. Select the "Menu Locations"
  - a. Make sure that your Primary Menu is set to "Primary" and Social Menu is set to "Social Media"
15. Click the **back button**, and click on **"Primary"**
16. **Click "Add Items"** to add links to other websites or new pages
17. You can change the order by dragging the page buttons, or clicking the "reorder" button underneath the page buttons.

### Connect your Blog to a Social Media Page or Platform:

(i.e. Twitter, Facebook, Instagram)

1. Look at the left sidebar.
2. Next to "Themes," **click white button that says "Customize"**
3. Inside the Customizer, click **"Menus"**
4. Select the **"Menu Locations"**
  - a. Make sure that your Primary Menu is set to "Primary" and Social Menu is set to "Social Media"
5. Click the **back button**, and click on **"Social Media"**
6. Click on the down arrow of the social media site you are linking to.
7. Paste in your web address (example, [www.twitter.com/showsketcher](http://www.twitter.com/showsketcher))
8. Ignore the other options unless you know what they do.

Some blogs have actual twitter and instagram feeds that appear on them. You can do this with a Plugin, but you have to pay for a higher priced version of Wordpress to install them. :(
